FORTNIGHT FOR FREEDOM HOLY HOUR  
FOR BERGEN COUNTY



As part of the Fortnight for Freedom for Religious Liberty a Holy Hour is planned for Bergen County on June 26<sup>th</sup> at Most Blessed Sacrament Church, 787 Franklin Lake Road, Franklin Lakes at 7:00 pm with Bishop John Flesey presiding. Archbishop Myers in a recent letter to the priests of the Archdiocese wrote: "I am hoping and praying that a more earnest reflection by those entrusted with the care of the common good, will lead them to embrace the broader view of religious liberty and respect for the individual conscience that is both the tradition and the hallmark of the American commitment to ordered liberty." Archbishop William Lori of Baltimore also explained: "The need for prayer, education, and action in defense of religious liberty has never been greater. The Fortnight for Freedom exists to meet that need. This year's Fortnight occurs just weeks before August 1, when the administration's mandate coercing us to violate our deeply-held beliefs will be enforced against most religious non-profits. During the Fortnight the Supreme Court's decisions on the definition of marriage will likely be handed down as well. Those decisions could have a profound impact on religious freedom for generations to come." Please join in prayer with brothers and sisters throughout the Archdiocese for the protection of our most precious freedom.


ANNULMENT INFORMATION EVENING

## R.C.I.A.

### Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults

RCIA is designed to welcome adults into our Catholic faith. Preparation is a year-long ongoing process culminating at the Easter Vigil Mass and Easter Season. The goal is to receive the Sacraments of Baptism (for non-Christians), Confirmation and Holy Eucharist.

### IS RCIA FOR YOU or SOMEONE YOU KNOW?

Do you know someone or are you someone who is interested in becoming Catholic or is a Catholic but has yet to receive all of the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist)? The RCIA is a process of prayer, reflection, and learning that allows for the continual discernment of God's will in our lives. Candidates include:

- Non-baptized adults who wish to enter the Catholic Church
- Baptized adult Christians of another denomination (i.e. Lutheran, Anglican, Presbyterian) who wish to continue their Christian faith in the Catholic Church
- Adult baptized Catholics who have not completed the Sacraments of Initiation (Holy Communion and/or Confirmation) and wish to do so.

### PHYSICIAN-ASSISTED SUICIDE...

#### What Is At Stake? A Recipe for Elder Abuse

The NJ Death with Dignity Act A3328/S2259 is a recipe for elder abuse. The most obvious reason is due to a lack of oversight when the lethal dose is administered. For example, there are no witnesses required and the death occurs in private. With this situation, the opportunity is created for an heir, or for another person who will benefit from the patient's death, to administer the lethal dose to the patient without his consent. Even if he struggled, who would know? Oppose the NJ Death with Dignity Act.

Robert P. George is McCormick Professor of Jurisprudence and Director of the James Madison Program in American Ideals and Institutions at Princeton University. He is a member of the U.S. Commission on International Religious Freedom, and has served on the President's Council on Bioethics and as a presidential appointee to the U.S. Commission on Civil Rights. He was a judicial fellow at the Supreme Court of the United States, where he received the Justice Tom C. Clark Award. He is the author or editor of numerous books in the fields of constitutional law, ethics, and legal and political philosophy and has recently co-authored the book *What is Marriage? Man and Woman: A Defense* (Encounter Books, 2012) with Sherif Girgis and Ryan T. Anderson. Professor George is a recipient of the U.S. Presidential Citizens Medal and the Honoric Medal for the Defense of Human Rights of the Republic of Poland. He is a member of the Council on Foreign Relations.


