WALKING PILGRIMAGE

Thursday, August 9th - 12th



Would you be interested in joining a walking pilgrimage to honor Blessed Virgin Mary? Pilgrimages are one of the oldest and most beautiful expressions of our faith.

The 35th Walking Pilgrimage will begin at 6:00 am, on Thursday, August 9th. at Sts. Peter and Paul Church in Great Meadows, NJ. It will conclude with a Holy Mass celebrated on Sunday, August 12th at 2:00 pm at the Shrine of Our Lady of Czestochowa in Doylestown, PA.

Mass will be celebrated daily. There will be many opportunities for confession, counseling, reflection and fellowship.

Pilgrims will sleep in their personal tents at provided campsites. Main luggage will be transported on a truck, so you need to carry very little. The Franciscans Friars of the Renewal lead the English speaking group.

Registration costs per day: Adults \$26.00, Young Adults (15-24): \$21.00, Children (7-14): \$11.00, Children under 7: Free, Seniors (65+): flat fee: \$5.00 for 1-4 days. Your registration includes: baggage transport, insurance, on-site First Aid, rest stops, campsites, provisions, etc.

The Pilgrimage hosted by St. Elizabeth's in Wyckoff will include time in Florence, Siena, Assisi, Orvieto & Rome. Fr. Roberto Ortiz, Parochial Vicar at St. Elizabeth's will share his insights 50 years after Vatican II and celebrate mass each day in different churches in each city. The cost per person is \$3,400.00 (Two in a room) or \$4,100.00 (Single occupancy). This price includes - Bus transportation from St. Elizabeth's Parish to Kennedy International Airport, round-trip airfare, Kennedy/Rome including departure taxes and fuel surcharges, all manager plus city sightseeing guides, 9 nights hotel accommodations (twin bedded rooms with private bath), full breakfast daily, 7 dinners, entrance fees to all sites included in the Itinerary, taxes and service charges, baggage handling at all hotels, tips to the tour manager, bus driver and city sightseeing guides.
